6. Emission Reduction Techniques (ERT's) should be used to minimize fire emissions. ERT's include, but are not limited to:

- Minimize the material to be burned
- Prevent fire from spreading by "lining" the area (clearing an area of combustibles) where open burn is being conducted and the application of fire retardant foam, or water
- Allow the material to dry before burning
- Minimize soil content in slash piles by constructing piles under dry soil conditions or by using hand piling methods (minimizes smoldering)
- Burn in organized piles (controls fire spread)
- Use a back fire when grass is burned (back firing is burning in opposite direction of the wind)
- Extinguish smoldering items that produce excessive emissions
- Burn before litter fall (excessive tree/shrub leaf or needle accumulation)
- Burn prior to precipitation

7. **Burning the following material is illegal:** *Household garbage, petroleum products (tarpaper, tires, plastics, rubber, oil, etc.) Landscape materials and clippings that cause noxious fumes. Inorganic pesticides, lead, cadmium, mercury, batteries, hazardous materials and arsenic compounds.*

10. You are required to contact dispatch please **BEFORE** burning, (928) 536-7500.

- **There are certain times that no burning is allowed; you must call prior to ignition.**
- **You must have responsible person present at your burn location for the duration of the burn.**
- **You may be required to make arrangements or obtain special permission and instructions from your local fire department, before being allowed to burn.**

I further state that I will assume responsibility for conducting open burning in accordance with the Arizona Administrative Code, Title 18, Chapter 2 and any open burning permit issued thereof.
